Re: Parent Payments 2021

Balwyn Primary School Council has approved the 2021 parent payment arrangements.

School Council and the Finance Sub-committee have worked closely with the Principal and Business Manager to develop arrangements that will enable the school to ensure the continued provision of high quality programs and services, upgrading of resources and opportunities for enhanced learning experiences for our students.

School Councils are able to request payments for essential student learning items, which include student stationery, online subscriptions for learning activities and excursions/activities that are considered part of the curriculum. In view of the COVID-19 environment, in 2021 student stationery will be available in the form of individual student packs which families are able to purchase directly from our supplier COS for delivery to their home address. In addition, a separate charge covering art and classroom craft supplies, online subscriptions and diary (Years 3-6) will continue to be via Compass - essential student learning items payment. A Fee Schedule, Student Pack list and COS ordering details follow. Free delivery is available for a limited time on Student Pack orders exceeding \$55 (incl GST).

An annual excursion charge is included as a convenient way of paying for curriculum excursions and activities rather than per event, however the option of paying for activities as they occur is still available. School Council has approved the amount of the 2021 excursion levy to be \$155 per child, based on proposed curriculum-based excursions/activities and additional whole school music and cyber safety activities. As activities in 2020 were heavily restricted due to the impact of COVID-19, families whose students were enrolled in 2020 and who paid the excursion levy will have had a credit raised for the unspent portion of the levy. This will be used progressively during the year and a request for payment will be made only once the credit has been fully utilised.

Support of voluntary subject, service and financial contributions makes a real difference to the quality of resources and services that our students access. These include eLearning equipment and curriculum resources, which require ongoing upgrading and replacement. Continued access to professional health advice through our school nurse and maintenance of our grounds and buildings also require ongoing investment. In 2021, the voluntary subject/service contributions requested remain the same as in 2020 and School Council gratefully acknowledges donations in this category.

This year, generous donations to our Library and Building Funds from our community have enabled:

- Purchase of library books at approximately \$7,000; and
- Installation of blinds in classrooms at more than \$8,000.

In addition, contributions in excess of \$4,000 via voluntary donations from our community will be put towards the fencing and landscaping of the southern boundary of the school.

School Council has again included a voluntary financial contribution request on behalf of State Schools' Relief, which is a not for profit organisation that supports the needs of underprivileged Victorian government school students by providing school uniforms, shoes and educational resources. We hope that the school community will continue to support this initiative as they did so generously in 2020, with \$2,700 being donated. The school's preferred payment option is Compass. The requested payment categories and amounts are listed on the Compass Parent Portal, where you may choose to pay the charges in full or in three instalments from your credit/debit card. Payments (first instalment or full payment) are requested by 1 February 2021 but can be made earlier if convenient. Should you require assistance, please contact the school office. Parent payments and contributions can also be made by cash or cheque at the office or by using BPay.

The school appreciates that families may sometimes experience financial difficulty in meeting payment requests. A number of support options are available to parents who have difficulty making payments, including access to second-hand uniforms, State Schools' Relief and the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund. ## FRE NSTRUCTION

- Parents may choose to purchase essential items through the school or provide their own.

## **Optional Items**

- tems and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are offered in addition to the standard curriculum.
- These are provided to students on a userpays basis.

### **Voluntary Contributions**

- Voluntary contributions support the school to continue to be the best local school for all students and can be for general or specific purpose.
- Students will not be disadvantaged in any way if parents do not make a contribution.

#### HEADPHONES FOR STUDENTS – RECOMMENDATIONS AND REGULAR CHECKING

#### Selecting new headphones

Selecting headphones is a very important decision. Some headphones produce sound that can be quite loud and may be difficult for children to easily control. It is also important to note that headphones have a finite life span and will degrade over time.

When selecting new headphones for your child to use, we recommend the following:

Over ear headphones are preferable – bud earphones/headphones can fill up with wax or other material and may be difficult for children to use easily.

Volume limited headphones – this helps reduce the risk of the volume getting too high.

To assist parents with the selection of headphones for school use:

- Foundation (Prep) year level will have headphones included in the mandatory section of the student pack.
- Years 1 to 6 will have an optional choice for headphones included in the student pack should headphones need replacing. See section below.

## Checking existing headphones for student re-use

Balwyn Primary School promotes the re-use of headphones when still in good working order. However it is important that parents and children (where possible) check headphones regularly to ensure they are in full working condition.

If you or your child notice something unusual about the sound coming through the headphones, check them carefully and consider a replacement. Please check with your child on a regular basis regarding the sound quality of their set in use at school. If there is any doubt the headphones should be taken home by your child for an adult to check the quality.

Some signs that the headphone might need replacing are:

- crackling sounds coming through one or both sides of the headphones and/or
- sound disappears and reappears from either side whilst using the headphones and/or
- moving the cable causes sound to be lost or crackling to be heard and/or
- visible damage to wire (cables) to headphones (i.e. splitting or exposed wires).

Please ensure your child's headphones are clearly marked with the child's name. It may be helpful for you to record the year of purchase and the dates on which they are checked.

## \*\*IMPORTANT INFORMATION REGARDING YOUR ORDER

COVID-19 has had a large impact on the transport industry and Australia Post has advised delays are possible over January due to an expected surge in demand. Sending your order as early as you can, and by the dates advised below, means your School Packs will have the best chance of arriving in time for the start of school. We'll still deliver items sent after these dates as quickly as possible, but it will be difficult to get them to you in time for the start of school.

**Delivery Service** – All orders will be sent via Australia Post. A specific time of delivery cannot be requested. In the event that nobody is available to receive the delivery, the goods will be taken to the nearest post office for collection. A card will be left in your mailbox confirming this.

**Delivery Guarantee** – Orders placed before 7<sup>th</sup> December will be delivered to your home by 21<sup>st</sup> December. Orders placed before 11<sup>th</sup> January will be delivered to your home prior to the commencement of Term 1 2021. Orders placed after this date cannot be guaranteed to arrive on time.

**Delivery Charges** – Orders less than \$55 (incl GST) will incur a \$10.95 (incl GST) delivery charge, regardless of the date on which they were placed.

Orders greater than \$55 (incl GST), placed on or before 6th December 2020, will be delivered free of charge. Orders placed after the 6th December 2020, will incur a \$10.95 (incl GST) delivery charge.
